# The Constitution of India



## Preamble

**WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA**, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

**JUSTICE**, social, economic and political;

**LIBERTY** of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;

**EQUALITY** of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all

**FRATERNITY** assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation; **IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY** this **26th day of November, 1949**, do

**HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.**

## Fundamental Duties

**It shall be the duty of every citizen of India –**

- (a) to abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- (b) to cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- (c) to uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
- (d) to defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- (e) to promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- (f) to value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
- (g) to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life, and to have compassion for living creatures;
- (h) to develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
- (i) to safeguard public property and to abjure violence;
- (j) to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement.

## Advisory For Parents

Your children are of immense importance to the school, and their potential is limitless. As the most influential figures in their lives and their first educators, your partnership is vital in shaping their behaviour and success. We encourage DIPSITES to show respect and gratitude to their parents, grandparents and teachers while striving for their aspirations.

We kindly ask parents and guardians to keep the following guidelines in mind when entrusting your children to the school as we embark on a New Academic Session together.

### ❖ **Academic & Developmental Excellence:**

#### 1. **Punctuality and Presentation**

Ensure your child maintains proper personal hygiene, dresses appropriately, and arrives on time. The School ID card must be worn daily without fail.

#### 2. **Monitoring and Engagement**

Proactively prepare your child for weekly assessments. Stay engaged by keeping track of the Periodic Test score & Report Card, reviewing teachers' remarks in classwork and homework, and regularly checking the school portal or Almanac for updates and other instructions.

#### 3. **Holistic Development**

Encourage a holistic approach by fostering your child's involvement in academics, extracurricular activities, and sports in equal measure to ensure balanced development.

#### 4. **Responsible Spending**

For students in Class III and above, please limit pocket money to a maximum of Rs. 50/- and discourage unnecessary or extravagant spending.

#### 5. **Personal Accountability**

Teach your child to take responsibility for his/her belongings. Crucially, ensure that items like blazers and sweaters are clearly labelled with their name.

### ❖ **Safety, Security, and Conduct :**

#### 1. **Prohibited Items and Confiscation Policy**

Parents are requested to strictly prohibit their child from bringing expensive items to school, such as mobile phones, cameras, or electronic gadgets. Wearing jewellery is strictly forbidden.

- Items found in violation of this rule will be confiscated.
- Parents must provide a written assurance that such breaches will not recur.
- Confiscated mobile phones and cameras will only be returned upon the student's graduation in Class XII or upon issuance of a Transfer Certificate.

## 2. Prevention of Bullying

In alignment with CBSE guidelines, addressing and preventing bullying and ragging is a shared responsibility between the school and parents. Encourage your child to cultivate a positive and respectful attitude towards their peers, the community, and the nation.

## 3. Escort Card Mandatory

Parents must carry the Escort Card when visiting the school for functions or while dropping off/collecting their child.

- In case of loss or damage, submit an application along with two identical photographs to the school office.
- A temporary Identity/Escort Card will be issued, with a replacement fee of Rs. 50/- for each card.
- Any further loss should be reported to the Wing Incharge and the Principal.

## ❖ Communication and Absence Management :

### 1. Handling Absences

If your child is absent, ensure your child completes all missed class assignments under the guidance of the respective teachers.

### 2. Absence Documentation

- Parents must provide an explanation for a student's absence in the given format.
- This format is valid for up to two days of consecutive absence.
- For absences exceeding two days on medical grounds, a written application signed by the parent, along with a Medical Certificate, Fitness Certificate, and Prescription, is mandatory.

### 3. Leave Policy (Strictly Enforced)

Short leave or half-day leave is strictly prohibited.

- In genuine emergencies, parents must submit a written request, either in person or via email, for approval.
- A gate pass issued by the Principal is mandatory and must be presented at the school gate when leaving.
- The child will only be allowed to leave when accompanied by a

parent.

- If parents are unavailable, only a guardian listed in the School Almanac will be authorized to take the child.

#### **4. Direct Communication with the School**

- For addressing concerns or seeking guidance, parents can write to the school at **contact\_us@dpsbulandshahr.com**.
- All correspondence will be reviewed and responded to promptly after consultation with the concerned teachers.
- Any changes in address, phone number, or bus route must be promptly communicated to the school office via email and informed to the respective class teacher.

#### **5. Meetings with Teachers**

Parents or guardians are not allowed to visit their ward or teachers directly in the classroom. For discussions with teachers, prior approval must be obtained from the school. Appointments will be scheduled accordingly after school hours.

#### **6. Deliveries Prohibited**

Parents are requested not to send or deliver tiffin boxes or water bottles to the reception. This measure has been implemented to ensure the safety and security of all students.

#### **7. Lost and Found Procedures**

Students who find lost items must deposit them immediately at the school office or with the class teacher. The school is not responsible for the loss of valuable items (which should not be brought to school). Parents may enquire about lost items at the school office during designated hours.

### **❖ Health, Wellness, and Medical Records :**

#### **1. Health Education**

We request all parents to impart Health Education to their children, emphasizing the following practices:

- Maintain personal hygiene like neat & ironed uniform, trimmed nails, hair, and polished shoes.
- Exercise regularly and sleep for at least seven hours daily.
- Have a balanced diet and avoid junk food.
- Drink water which is either boiled or filtered, students are advised to bring their own water bottles from home.
- Get dewormed at least once every year, with advice taken from the family physician.

- Undergo dental and eye check-ups once every year.
- Ensure immunization is done as per the schedule.

## 2. Infectious Disease Quarantine

Students suffering from infectious diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine:

- **Chicken Pox:** Till complete falling of the scabs.
- **Cholera:** Till the child is completely well.
- **Measles:** Two weeks after the rash disappears.
- **Mumps:** Until the swelling has gone; about one month.
- **Whooping Cough:** Six weeks.
- **Jaundice:** Six weeks after recovery.

## 3. Medical History Record and Supervision

Students diagnosed with conditions such as Asthma, Epilepsy, Juvenile Diabetes, Rheumatic Heart Disease, Neurological disorders, or similar illnesses must remain under the regular supervision of a specialist doctor. Details of their medical history and ongoing treatment should be recorded in the School Almanac.

- The school reserves the right to take action against any student whose off-campus online activity negatively affects the reputation of the school, its students, or staff, particularly concerning bullying or harassment.
- Parents are requested to monitor their child's online interactions and screen time.

❖ **School Transportation Protocol :**

- Parents using the school bus facility must ensure their child is at the designated stop on time.
- Parents must not argue with or distract the bus crew (driver/attendant). Any concerns regarding transportation should be reported directly to the school administration.
- Students are expected to follow all safety rules while on the school bus.

## School Rules

### Session 2026-2027

1. A student should carry his/ her almanac to school everyday which should have the latest passport size photograph of the parents , guardians and the student duly pasted and the identity information signed by the parents .
2. Students who come to school by private conveyance should arrive at school 5 minutes before the morning bell . Students must lock their bicycles . They are not allowed to bring their scooter or bike to school .
3. Students should maintain personal hygiene and come neatly dressed in school uniform. No student will be allowed to enter the school premises without proper uniform . Repeated defaulters will be sent back home . Students must wear their school identity card everyday .
4. Non - Sikh boys should get their hair cut at regular intervals . Fancy hair styles are not permitted . Sikh boys must wear green turbans / patkas .
5. Students are expected to respect school property and the property of others . No student should damage any school furniture , write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage things belonging to others. Damage done , even by accident , should be reported at once to the Class teacher, Coordinator, Headmistress, Headmaster, Vice Principal or Principal. Any damage done will be made good by the one who causes it by paying 10 times the actual cost of the damaged property . A warning letter will also be issued to the concerned child .
6. Students are advised to keep their classrooms , school building and campus as neat as possible and make use of dustbins .
7. Movement for activities and at dispersal should be done in silence and in an orderly fashion .
8. Students are not supposed to leave the class without permission or missing any teaching / games / activity period . Students must ensure that they carry the Class - Pass / Out Pass whenever they are required to move out of the classrooms .
9. **No books (other than text books or library books), magazines, pendrives, cassettes, cds or money should be brought to school without the Principal's permission .**

10. Students should observe polite standards wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their behaviour. **Bullying in any form- direct , indirect , cyber bullying or using foul language is punishable offence and may even merit expulsion from school** . It is expected that students behave in a manner which brings good name to the school community . They should not indulge in any anti - social activity in or outside the school , failing which the school may take disciplinary actions .
11. The school reserves the right to suspend or to take strict disciplinary action against a student whose performance in studies is constantly unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students .
12. The Report Card , being an important document , should be kept carefully. In case it is spoilt or lost , the concerned student **shall pay Rs . 100 in order to get a duplicate Report Card** ( on written request ) .
13. It is expected that the juniors are treated with love and affection by the seniors , while the juniors show all respect to their seniors. There should be perfect harmony among the students .
14. Students must strictly refrain from :

15. Bursting of crackers and playing with colours or any other such undesirable activity are liable to lead to expulsion from the school .
16. Students found tampering with the school records e.g. marks allotted by teachers in tests / exams are liable to strict disciplinary actions .
17. In case any student violates the school rules or indulges in any form of indiscipline, strict action like suspension / expulsion shall be taken against the student . If a student gets suspended twice and school authorities consider it necessary to suspend him / her for the third time, he / she will be expelled .
18. No student will be allowed to go home during school hours without the written permission of the Headmistress, Headmaster, Vice Principal or Principal.

19. Assignments & sample papers are available on the school website. However , a student may procure a copy of the assignment from the school on request .
20. Students should not have a Facebook or other social networking account as this may be misused. The honourable Supreme Court is also considering banning school students from opening a Facebook account.
- 21 Students should not share their GSuite Id password with anyone. Misuse of the same will lead to serious legal actions as per the provisions mentioned in Cyber Crime Laws.

## 22. ABSENTEEISM

- ❖ Parents should intimate the school when the student is absent stating the reasons for absence through email/written application .
- ❖ Students who have been sick should attach a medical fitness certificate along with the application.
- ❖ Students who require medical attention during school hours , will be sent by the teachers to the school clinic with a written note.
- ❖ Repeated absence without sanctioned leave or unexplained absence for six consecutive working days renders a student liable to having his / her name struck off the rolls without any notice. Re-admission may be granted only with the permission of the Principal followed by the payment of a fresh admission fee as applicable .
- ❖ All students are expected to attend school on the opening day after the vacations .
- ❖ It is compulsory for the students to complete 75 % of the attendance in the year to make them eligible to sit for the final examination. It would be appreciated if students have an average of atleast 90 % attendance before the examination.
- ❖ Erratic attendance will not be entertained whatsoever.

## 23. LATE ARRIVAL

- ❖ The school gate closes 5 minutes before the first bell.
- ❖ Repeated defaulters will be sent back home.

## 24. FEE PAYMENT AND WITHDRAWAL

- ❖ Fee should be paid in the first week of the specified months latest by 10th day of the month.
- ❖ Even if the students are admitted later during the term, fees for the whole academic session will be charged.
- ❖ If fee for a month in respect of any student is not paid in full by first week of that month, a fine of Rs. 10/- per day will be charged up to the end of the month. If without a valid reason the fee is not paid for a period of two months or more , the student's name will be struck off from the school roll and the student may be re - admitted only at the discretion of the Principal on payment of all arrears and a fresh admission fee.
- ❖ Fee can be deposited in advance for any number of months for the full session, if so desired.
- ❖ Fee may be deposited in Bank of Baroda, Akbarpur Branch, Bulandshahr/State Bank of India, Bulandshahr or online.
- ❖ In case of doubt regarding the payment of any dues, parents / guardians are advised to make the payment first and then clarify the matter from accounts deptt.
- ❖ Parents may kindly keep the fee deposit receipts in safe custody and produce these to the school in proof of their having made the payment.
- ❖ In case of any refund of extra charges levied by the school , parents may kindly deal directly with the office.
- ❖ Parents are requested to give correct particulars such as Admission No., Name, Class and Section of the student while depositing the fee.
- ❖ The parents desirous of discontinuing the studies of their ward at the end of the academic session must inform the school authorities latest by 1st March failing which one month tuition fee will be charged.
- ❖ A CLEAR CALENDAR MONTH'S NOTICE in writing or a month's fee in lieu of notice should be given before a pupil can be withdrawn from the school . However , in case of transfer or other contingencies of service Principal may waive the notice period as a special case at his discretion.

## Disciplinary Measures

1. Types :
  - (i) fine
  - (ii) penalization
  - (iii) withdrawal of school transport facility
  - (iv) suspension
  - (v) expulsion
2. Separate penalization would be practised for cheating cases caught with evidence (written material) or exchange of answer booklets/answer scripts during examinations. In such cases, 10 % marks will be deducted, a warning letter will be issued and the child will be debarred from receiving all the honours for that session.
3. Students who are into bullying and unruly behaviour will be debarred from P.E. periods . Structured counselling for such students needs to be followed till the child is reformed . A warning letter may be issued to the first time offenders depending upon the severity of the offence. If the same behaviour is repeated by the child despite counselling and warning then he / she will be suspended from school. In case of suspension , the child will be debarred from any honours that he / she may deserve for that session.
4. In case of misbehaviour with the teachers / peer group , the students will be warned / suspended for the first offence . The punishment will be decided after proper investigation, depending on the severity of misconduct.



## Improvement Procedures

### **Remedial Measures for students :**

Like our society at large, all the children are not the same. They have their individual personalities, their choices & their interests. We, at DPS Bulandshahr, aim at shaping the personality of each child, making them capable citizens for the future. But at times, some children do not reflect appropriate behaviour and do not conform to the school rules. Hence, keeping in mind their holistic development, it becomes imperative that some strict steps should be taken in such cases. The school has the following reformatory steps :

1. **An improvement card** is issued to such children for a week's time. They are given a feed back form where the respective class teacher & subject teachers daily put their remarks. Each day they report to the Wing Incharge. Such improvement card may be given for a minimum period of one week and can be continued for another week in case the child needs more improvement.

### 2. **Yellow Card**

Serious offences which reflect adversely on student's conduct e.g. breaking bounds, disobedience, telling lies, may lead to the infliction of a Yellow Card which deprives the offender of availing privileges in the school for a week. A student on a Yellow Card is not allowed to attend any programme, picnics or outings or buy any eatables from the canteen.

**The receipt of three yellow Cards may lead to the expulsion of the offender from the school on disciplinary grounds.**

Every teacher is empowered to inflict yellow cards for any negative or undesirable act, behaviour and conduct, which will be reflected in the Progress Report of the child.

## School Transport

Students can avail the school transport subject to the availability of seats. The parents should consult the school transport Incharge for the bus routes and other necessary details.

### BUS RULES

1. The bus facility once opted for has to be continued throughout the year. The bus facility, in special cases , can be discontinued or changed with prior permission of the school authorities with the next quarterly payment.
2. All students using the school bus are expected to be at the bus stop at least five minutes before the arrival of the bus.

**3. The bus will not wait for late comers.**

4. Students should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives.
5. No student should come near the entry door of the bus until it has made a complete stop.
6. All students must occupy vacant seats immediately after boarding their buses. No student should travel standing on the foot - board .
7. The front door of the bus is the only authorised entrance and exit.
8. The drivers are authorised to stop buses at the designated stops only, unless otherwise directed by the teacher on bus duty . The list of stops is prepared keeping in view the convenience and safety of all bus commuters and if deemed necessary, is subject to change by the school authority.
9. When the bus is moving, students must not move around in the bus or expose their heads or arms outside the window.
10. Students will be held responsible for any damage to buses caused by them.
11. Discarding of trash or food either inside or outside buses is not permitted.
- 12. Unruly behaviour like shrieking and shouting is strictly prohibited. Courteous behaviour is expected at all times.**
13. Students must not distract the driver's attention.
14. The teachers on bus duty and student bus - monitors are responsible for maintaining discipline in the buses. Any serious offence must be reported to the Principal without delay.
15. The student should not use any other means of transport for commuting to school if he / she is availing school transport . In case of exigency , if he/ she is not doing so, permission should be sought from the concerned authority and the teacher on bus duty should be duly informed.
16. Any form of indiscipline in the bus will lead to withdrawal of the facility.
17. All buses are fitted with the GPS System & Camera and all activities happening in the bus are monitored and action is taken accordingly.
18. No student will be allowed to discontinue school bus services after the month of December. However, a clear calendar month's notice or a month's fee in lieu of notice should be given in case school bus service withdrawal is requested before the month of December. Fees will be charged for all 12 months. A parent, who withdraws the transport facility before the vacations and rejoins after the vacations, may not be given the transport service facility. The transport fee is payable along with the school fees.

## VISITING HOURS FOR PARENTS

The school would always desire parents to maintain a close rapport with the teachers of their wards. Parents are advised to meet the respective Class teachers / Subject teachers / Class Coordinators / Subject Coordinators on the specified PTMs mentioned in the school calendar.

Teachers, Class Coordinators, Vice Principals & Headmaster/Headmistress are available for meetings after school hours, starting from 2:30 PM. However, parents may meet the Principal during school hours on all working days, in case of an emergency. For all other matters, a prior appointment must be scheduled well in advance.
